Introduction

Every generation of believers must face the dilemma of how to live in the tension between the possibility of Christ's immediate return and the impossibility of knowing exactly when He would come. Struggling through persecution, the Thessalonians found their hope in the soon return of Christ. Some believers were succumbing to the false teaching that the Second Coming of Christ had already come bringing with it the tribulations that they were now facing.

Paul clearly describes some of the major events that would precede the day of the Lord. A great falling away, or departure would lead to the revealing of the man of sin or Antichrist who would attempt to divert the churches true worship of God. This spirit of evil and deception already exists in the world today. Knowing and understanding the truth found in the Word of God helps guard against the lies of deception. Standing fast in the truth of the Word is the believers greatest defense against losing hope when the world around us seems dark and unfamiliar.

What does it say?

2 Thessalonians 2:1-12

1 Now, brethren, concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our gathering together to Him, we ask you, 2 not to be soon shaken in mind or troubled, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as if from us, as though the day of Christ had come. 3 Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin is revealed, the son of perdition, 4 who opposes and exalts himself above all that is called God or that is worshiped, so that he sits as God in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God.

5 Do you not remember that when I was still with you I told you these things? 6 And now you know what is restraining, that he may be revealed in his own time. 7 For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He who now restrains will do so until He is taken out of the way. 8 And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord will consume with the breath of His mouth and destroy with the brightness of His coming. 9 The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders, 10 and with all unrighteous deception among those who perish, because they did not receive the love of the truth, that they might be saved. 11 And for this reason God will send them strong delusion, that they should believe the lie, 12 that they all may be condemned who did not believe the truth but had pleasure in unrighteousness.
